On the slopes, on the highway, at work, at home - do you know what to do or what not to do until medical help arrives? Every member of PVS owes it to himself, his family, his community to be a card-carrying first-aider.

Here's how.

Red Cross STANDARD, ADVANCED, and INSTRUCTOR TRAINING courses will be offered in September on the following schedules at 2025 E st., N.W. (District Chapter House)

FAITC (Instructor) - 9:30-12:30, Tuesdays & Thursdays; Start Sept. 4, end Oct. 21' no prerequisite; 42 hours, Classroom #4

Standard - 9:30-12:30, Tuesdays & Thursdays; Sept. 4 - Sept. 16. Classroom #5 Advanced - 9:30-12:30, Tuesdays & Thursdays; Sept. 18 - Oct. 7, Classroom #5

FAITC - 9:30-12:30, Tuesdays & Thursdays, Oct. 9 - Oct. 27; must have Advanced first aid; 18 hours. Classroom #5.

Advanced - 1:00-4:00, Tuesdays & Thursdays; Sept. 18 - Oct. 7. Classroom #4

Evening Courses:

Standard - 7:00-10:00 pm, Mondays & Wednesdays; Sept. 3 - Oct. 6 Advanced - 7:00-10:00 pm, Mondays & Wednesdays; Sept. 17 - Oct. 6

FAITC - 7:00-10:00 pm, Mondays & Wednesdays; Oct. 8 - Oct. 27; must have Advanced first aid; 18 hours. Classroom #6.

Enroll now by calling 857-3642 between 9 am and 5 pm, or call RE 7-8300, evenings and weekends. If these schedules are not convenient, you may enroll in a later course. Call 857-3642 for information.

Your older teen-agers can take the courses too; 14 years old is the minimum age for these courses. There are also courses in Junior First Aid for 5th grade to High School children.
