EXCOM REPORT

The Executive Committee held its monthly meeting in Virginia this month meeting at Art Topping home in Anlington. Attending were President Ray McKinley, Vice President Marilyn Clark, EXCOM members Bill Hager and Julie King; Membership Chairlady Gail Gell, 7007 Editor Dick King, Trip Leader and BRSC delegate Bob Wyckoff and PSF delegate and host Art Topping. Missing due to a conflict in scheduling were EXCOMERS Pat Cope, Bob Marx and Penny Richards. Following appropriate greetings and hors D'oeuvres, the business meeting took place.

1. The Membership Chairlady gave an updated report which reflected a total membership of over one hundred members with nine new applicant mem-

bers and three junior members.

2. A financial report on the October meeting (the Wine and Cheese party) reflected a net loss in revenue due to the high expense for the meeting site. It was generally concluded that we would not again use that site.

3. There was no report available on the turnout or participation in the Antique Car show. This interesting activity certainly has its advocates and EXCOM would appreciate receiving

a report on how the event went.

The EXCOM concluded that all was going well (see Coming Events and Ski Trips columns) and is looking forward to the double barrelled events in November. One change was noted. Due to no accomodations available at Blue Knob in the desired time frame, the planned trip there is now cancelled. Trip Leader Bill Hager will now coordinate and lead the PVS contingent to the BRSC Ski_O_Ree on February 11–12.

5. BRSC delegate Bob Wychoff reported on the BRSC fall meeting which took place October 16th at Bryce Mountain, Virginia. A Ski-O-Ree report was given, a Safety Avelanche movie shown and the need for a Ski-Talk delegate was discussed. Also, PVS was asked to be the sponsoring Club for the 1978 BRSC Tennis Townnament. EXCOM voted on this matter and agreed to take on this task. This will be a unified Club effort and all assistance will be most welcome. The Spring meeting of the BRSC will be held April 16th and will be sponsored by the Ski Club of Maryland, Ltd.

6. The Montgomery County Recreation Dept. contacted the Club and requested participation in a fall Ski Fair. EXCOM accepted and PVS will have a table set up at the Cabin John Junior HS.

Dear Club Official:

The Blue Ridge Ski Council is sponsoring a series of three racing clinics during the month of December. They are at Jack Frost Mt. Dec. 10-11, Dec. 17-18, and Elk Mt. Dec. 26-29. The details (or at least most of Jack Frost them) are: \$12 per day This includes lifts and 3 hours of Price: on-snow instruction. Registration: 9am at the ski school desk On-snow instruction periods are from 10-11:30 am and 2-3:30 pm daily. The first on-snow session will be for orientation, dividing into smaller groups of similar skiing levels, and free skiing instruction. The second and third on-snow sessions will be running gates and/or additional free skiing instruction depending on the meeds of the group. A timed race will be held during the fourth session. Jack Frost now has video taping to aide in its instruction. The period 11:30 am to 2 pm is reserved for lunch and free skiing. We will also have sessions on equipment maintenance and physical conditioning. These will be held after the Saturday afternoon on-snow session. This will be the format for both Jack Frost clinics. This clinic will be suitable for beginning through advanced racers. Elk Mt.

Price: \$60 for four days plus lift tickets Registration: 8:30 am at a special desk in the rear of the main lodge Discount lift tickets can be purchased at the registration desk. Slalom Trail will be reserved for racing instruction. Participants in the clinic will be permitted to use the racers! lift line at the new double chair. There will be heavy emphasis on runming gates both SL and GS. There will be instruction in course setting and topics such as equipment maintenance and racing strategy will be covered in off-snow classes. There will be a get acquainted beer, pretzel, etc. party on Monday, the 26th. Instruction sessions will be from 9:30-12 and 1-4 each day. Enrollment will be limited to about 45. This clinic will be most suitable for intermediate and advanced racers.
