Take 4th left turnonto Scott Drive. Cross single lane wooden bridge. After bridge, make 4th left turn onto Overlea Drive to 1st driveway on left - 9211 Overlea Drive- and you are there.

"From here, the Confederates watched the movements of the Union Army in the Shenadoah Valley and, by signals, relayed their information to Richmond.


"Hikers can backtrack to the cars or make a circuit which will add a mile or two to the hike. Dinner at the Masons just north of Front Royal on share the expenses basis.
