DIRECTIONS TO January meeting at Suzanne Boisclair's: 6821 N 31st St. Arlington, Va. Te1:703-532-0511. FROM VIRGINIA via Rte 7

(Leesburg Pike) or via Rte 29 (Lee Howv) drive to Falls CHurch where-they cross at Broad & Washington Sts. Here take Rte 29N and drive 5 traffic lights. You are now on top of overpass spanning Rte 66). Landmarks here are Exxon Station on right, First Va. Bank on left. Turn left(on bank's side) and drive 9 short blocks to Suzanne's house - first one on the left at corner of 31st and Westmoreland Sts.

FROM D.C.: Get to Va on Rte 66, take exit 69 (Sycamore). leave ramp on right side, immediately pull left to reach traffic light on Washington Blvd. Turn left on Washington Blvd and drive 10 short blocks to Suzanne's place corner of 31 and Westmoreland sts. FROM MD. via Beltway (495 south)on left side take Exit 12 A Rte 66 East. (Proceed straight ahead; this connecting road eventually merges with Rte 66 on which you soon take Exit 68 (Westmoreland). Do stay on right side as Westmoreland comes right after a bend and cannot be seen from afar. Bear left at bottom of ramp and proceed straight to Susanne's -5 short blocks to corner of 31st and Westmoreland sts.
