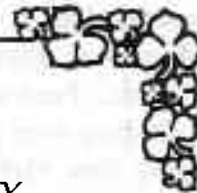
Fellow PVSers:

To enhance the opportunity to obtain reservations with United and to lower the airline price, the trip leaders, Barbara and Fred Leonhardt, moved the trip ahead by one day so that the trip will now run Thur. to Thur., Jan. 17-24, 2002. The trip has now been finalized with the exception of the cost of the optional trip insurance. We will fly on United Airlines from Dulles to Denver and then to Eagle/Vail and return. PVS will be joining other Blue Ridge Ski Council clubs for six days of skiing in legendary Chamonix, France. This traditional European area with over 70 pistes in six major areas, provides ample skiing for all abilities. After September 1, we will be accepting applications from those on our waiting list.

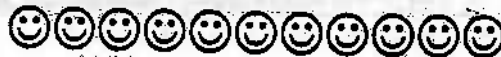
FAREWELL TO OUR HAVEN...

He was subsequently moved back to the Washington area and has lived in Potomac, MD for the past 24 years.

In 1980, Gene resigned from IBM and held various management positions with technology companies and in 1999 he formed Sharer Associates, Inc. The firm consults with technology firms on corporate infrastructure, contracting and financial matters.

For the past 23 years, Gene and Wilma have skied at Snowshoe, WV, having taken a townhouse unit there in 1982, intermittently taking ski trips to Vail and to San Moritz, Switzerland. They have 4 children with spouses and 8 grandchildren.

IN MEMORIAM: JOHN J. MATTHEWS

October 8, 1923 - June 4, 2001

John J. Matthews, a member of PVS, passed away suddenly on June 4, 2001 as the consequence of a stroke which occurred just a few days before.

Those who have met John on ski trips or various PVS events, some of which he volunteered to lead, will long remember him as a good-natured individual who was a delight to be with on group activities. He loved the outdoors and outdoor activities throughout his entire life. He was active not only in skiing, but also in bicycling, hiking, and adventure travel. His career was in community planning, and after his retirement he was able to enjoy his love of the outdoors and to work as a volunteer for community and other organizations. For 26 years, he volunteered with the Washington Ear, which reads the newspaper and other reading matter to blind people.

At least 40 PVSers attended his memorial service on June 23, which was led by PVS member Marvin Hass who noted that on bike trips John would usually volunteer to be "sweep" in order to offer help and encouragement to those who were slower. Lu Beale represented PVS in paying tribute to John.
