From Washington DC, via Chain Bridge

Take Chain Bridge onto N. Glebe Rd., crossing into Virginia. Go straight (not turning right on Chain Bridge Road). As you go up the hill to Glebe Road, do not take the turnoff to Military Rd. At the top of the hill after a big curve, the first right is River Street – there is a sign there that says Chain Bridge Forest. Turn right onto River St. Go 3 blocks on River. You go down a hill and up the next. At the top of that hill (the third left) turn left on **Highwood**. Go to the very end, about 4 or 5 blocks, ending in a cul-de-sac. BRSC Snowmass, Colorado Ski Trip 2020

Saturday, January 25 – Saturday, February 1, 2020

Trip Details

Once again we will be staying at the Snowmass Mountain Chalet (SMC) which offers a convenient ski in, ski out location. Check the web-site at www.mountainchalet.com. The "Land Only" package includes: transportation to and from Aspen airport (7am -11pm); 5-day Senior lift pass (good for all four ski areas in the Aspen complex, free shuttle bus) with option for extra days; 7 nights lodging (double occupancy); daily breakfast & soup lunch; luggage handling; a welcome reception; BRSC sponsored après ski events & a dinner, plus the NASTAR ski race. Additional nights at Snowmass are an option based on availability. Trip insurance is available through Encompasse Tours and is highly recommended. For trail information check www.aspensnowmass.com.

The basic package at \$1,820 includes a 5 day Senior lift pass for skiers 65 and over. Skiers under 65 will have to add \$81.00.

The Mountain Chalet

The **Snowmass Mountain Chalet** is an independent lodge, managed on-site, with easy access to the slopes. Each of the 64 rooms has either 2 queen beds or 1 king bed, **depending on availability**. All rooms have: hair dryer, TV, small refrigerator, etc. The lodge has a nice lounge on the main floor with chairs, game tables, fireplace, and large windows overlooking the slopes. There is an elevator, exercise room, outdoor pool, a hot tub and laundry facilities. A full breakfast is served family style each morning. A complimentary soup lunch is served from Noon to 1:30 PM. The lodge has no restaurant for dinner. However, the Snowmass Mall, on the level above, and hotel area below (via the small gondolas) has diverse restaurants at all price levels. Bus service stops are nearby for trips to a nearby grocery store, into the town of Aspen, to other Aspen ski areas, and to Glenwood Springs.

Trip Insurance

Trip insurance is recommended.

Travel Guard is available through our travel agent, Encompasse Tours, at **Encompasse.com**. (The insurance link will connect you to Travel Guard.) The insurance provides coverage for accident, illness, injury, or death to attendee or immediate family member. There are several plans available, depending on your situation. You will have more reimbursement options by purchasing shortly after sending in your trip deposit. Please read carefully before choosing. And, be sure to save all receipts concerning your trip!

Cancellation Policy and Fees

If it becomes necessary for you to cancel your trip, the trip leaders will try to minimize your losses, although some fees are mandated by the hotel and tour operator. All cancellations must be in writing. We strongly urge you to purchase trip insurance (see above).

Please take the time to ensure the information you provide is correct; and take note of deadline dates!

<u>Cancellation fees are as follows</u>: <u>Dates and costs are consistent with requirements and penalties imposed by vendors per contracted agreements</u>. <u>LAND Only Package</u>: \$300 after September 28th until December 1st; after December 1st, cost is entirely non-refundable.

<u>If you are a "single" participant</u> requesting space on a PVS-endorsed ski trip and need a roommate, we recommend each of you purchase insurance to cover both of you if one of the roommates cancels. Otherwise, you will be offered the choice of one of the following three options:

- 1) Helping the trip leader find a replacement trip participant who will fill the space vacated; **or**
- 2) Staying on the ski trip by paying the "single supplement" or
- 3) Canceling from the ski trip and paying all currently due penalties.

PARK CITY – DEER VALLEY, March 7-14, 2020

Park City and Deer Valley are premier ski destinations. We invite PVS skiers and their friends to a unique PVS Park City – Deer Valley trip.

PARK CITY has varied terrain for all skiers. It has 348 trails, close to half of which are suited for intermediate skiers,



13 bowls and a 3,200-foot vertical drop with advanced and expert terrain. It now incorporates the Canyons ski area. *Park City has broad skiing opportunities for everybody*.

Known for its upscale amenities, including fine mountain dining and shopping, DEER VALLEY claims to be the nation's premier ski resort. It has an uphill lift capacity of 50,470 skiers per hour. Notably, *Deer Valley does not allow snowboards* and limits ticket sales to prevent overcrowding.

PARK CITY's Main Street is on the National Register of Historic Places and is home to dozens of fine restaurants, bars, unique shopping experiences and art galleries.

TRIP INCLUSIONS:

- Seven nights at the Peaks Hotel Park City (two to a room), including lodging taxes and baggage handling. The Peaks is a full service hotel with pools, a sauna, fitness center, and ski storage.
- Daily breakfasts.
- Welcoming dinner Saturday, March 7th.
- Departing dinner Friday, March 13th.
- At least 3 Après Ski events.

SLOPES TRANSPORTATION: A City ski bus stops 21 steps from the hotel entrance. Buses come every 20 minutes. Also, the Peaks has a private Park City shuttle every hour on the hour and a Deer Valley shuttle every hour on the half hour.

AIR: Because of different travel and payment preferences, we do not include air transportation and airport shuttles. Doug Horstman of Encompasse Tours recommends Canyon Transportation, which can be booked online, for transportation between the airport and hotel.

LIFT TICKETS: Trip participants may want to ski four days at Park City and two at Deer Valley, but they can vary lift ticket purchases to meet preferences. Lift ticket prices vary with skier ages, the number of ski days purchased areas, ski pass arrangements and the like. There are ski area discounts for 20 tickets, which need not necessarily be for the same day or person. Doug Horstman will package participants' lift tickets for convenience and the best available prices. We shall charge separately for ski lift tickets when they are purchased closer to the trip.

SIGN-UPS: *Trip participants can sign up now*. The trip should be during a good ski weather week. We shall try to maximize trip cohesion and provide for coordinated group-member skiing, good restaurants and other desired, joint activities. Prices for included items - \$1,260 per person; initial deposit - \$50 per person. -Cancellation Policy: As required by the Peaks Hotel, after October 1, \$992 is non-refundable. In the event a trip participant is required to cancel after that date, if another participant can fill the cancelled space, we shall refund the applicable amount that may be recovered. If a cancelling trip participant has a roommate who must bear hotel or other costs due to the cancellation, unless the roommates agree otherwise, the cancelling participant shall pay the pay amount of the single room supplement (*i.e.*, the amount attributable to the unused space). **We strongly recommend travel insurance to avoid losses caused by trip cancellations.** The Encompasse Tours website connects to Travel Guard travel insurance (TravelGuard.com/ASTP – 1-877-249-5376). 

PVS Visits Goddard Space Flight Center June 11, 2019

How many of us realize that we have a jewel of American science in our own backyard? The Goddard Space Flight Center, one of the centers of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, is home to scientists and engineers whose research informs us about our home here on Earth and about other worlds literally billions of



light years away in the distant reaches of the cosmos. During our tour, PVSers learned about Goddard's role in NASA's Earth Observing System, a series of satellites that monitor conditions on Earth related to our planet's health and well-being. Goddard is also responsible for operating the amazing Hubble Space Telescope, an incredible instrument through which we have learned so much about the origins of our universe and the potential for habitable planets outside our solar system. The James Webb Space Telescope, in which Goddard plays a key role, will be a monumental advancement beyond the Hubble when it is launched into space in about 2021. This space observatory will allow humans to look back in time to nearly the origin of the universe when the Big Bang occurred some 13 billion years ago.

A highlight of the tour was a presentation by one of our own, PVS member Dorian Janney. She and her colleagues

explained the Global Precipitation Measurement mission and the fascinating



ways that data from it are used here on Earth to better understand and make better use of our global resources. The GPM mission makes measurements of precipitation almost as it is happening around the globe. Those measurements allow users of the data to better manage water resources, agriculture, and worldwide energy infrastructures.
