The Survey - You'll recall that PVS made a concerted effort to give everyone an opportunity to be heard on the subject of weekend daytime or traditional evening monthly meetings/parties. We asked everyone through email to complete a survey and we tabulated the results.

We heard from over 1/3 of the members in the local area which is a great response for a survey. Those in favor of more weekend daytime meetings slightly outnumbered those who preferred the status quo. (Currently 3 out of 10 meetings per year are held on weekend afternoons and the other 7 are on Tuesday evenings.)

The Executive Committee discussed the results and, although survey results were not overwhelmingly in favor of weekend daytime meetings, the Committee made the decision to change the October meeting to a Sunday afternoon to add to the existing January, February and March meetings.



**From Washington, DC:** Take River Road (MD-190) to Falls Road in Potomac. Turn left onto Falls Road (MD-189), proceed <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of mile, and turn left onto Garden Way. Take the 2<sup>nd</sup> left onto Garden Court; house is the 4th on the left

**From Gaithersburg:** Take I-270 toward Washington and merge onto Falls Road (MD-189 S) via exit 5. Stay on Falls Road for about 5.6 miles. (You will go past River Road at Potomac Village.) Turn left onto Garden Way. Take the 2<sup>nd</sup> left onto Garden Court; house is the 4<sup>th</sup> on the left.

**From Virginia:** After crossing the American Legion Bridge into MD on the beltway, take exit 41 towards Carderock. Stay to the left and merge onto the Clara Barton Parkway. After 1.7 miles, turn left on MacArthur Blvd. After 2.2 miles, turn right on Falls Road (MD-189). Proceed 1.3 miles and turn right onto Garden Way. Take the 2<sup>nd</sup> left onto Garden Court; house is 4<sup>th</sup> on the left.

meandering to find the house, but once there, frivolity abounded!



## SKI TALK

A Happy New Year to all. It has been snowing in the Rockies, so we expect great snow for our first ski trip of the season. Over 30 people are joining the Snowmass trip mid January. Most are going for the week, but some are adding extra days either before or after the trip. Then, on January 30, the Mt. Bachelor trip takes off. Over 250 people from the Metropolitan area are joining this trip as part of the Blue Ridge Ski Council (BRSC). March 2, we take off for Austria to go glacier skiing. And, don't overlook the local ski areas. John Smith will be coordinating local skiing. See the article elsewhere in the TOOT.



You might want to test your ski legs at Whitetail on Friday, January 9, for the Ski Demo Day sponsored by Ski Center. People may be getting there at different times, so plan to meet in the cafeteria around 12:30 for lunch. Let John Smith know if you are planning on going. Be sure to take an ID with you, if you plan to demo skis.

You may have been reading about Vail and their Epic Pass, which covers over 20 ski resorts in the US and Europe. Now there is another mega-pass – **The Mountain Collective**. This is an alliance of seven premier independent ski destinations in North America – Alta/Snowbird, Aspen/Snowmass, Jackson Hole, Mammoth Mountain, Ski Banff-Lake Louise-Sunshine, Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows and Whistler Blackcomb. The Mountain Collective Pass costs \$399 and gives you two days of skiing at each of the resorts, plus a 50 percent discount on all additional days with no blackout dates. With the high cost of lift tickets (\$100+ per day), this could be a great deal if you are going to these resorts. You could break even in only four to six days. However, if you belong to a ski club and go on group trips, you may do even better, since we get discounted lift tickets. That is a huge benefit of group ski trips. At any rate, there is a lot of competition going on in the ski industry and we just may benefit!

The other big news in the industry is that Vail is investing \$50 million to connect Park City Ski Resort and The Canyons. They are planning on building a gondola this summer to connect the resorts! It may be in operation for the 2016 ski season.

**CALL FOR PROPOSALS FOR SKI TRIPS FOR THE 2016 SEASON**. Anyone interested in leading a ski trip, let me know. The BRSC trips for 2016 are: **Snowbird, Utah** (early February) and **Madonna de Campiglio, Italy** (early March). Even if you are not interested in leading a trip, let me know where you want to go. This will help us plan future destinations.

# PVS/BRSC SKIING AND SIGHTSEEING ADVENTURE MT. BACHELOR AND BEND, OREGON JANUARY 31-FEBRUARY 7, 2015

Mt. Bachelor is the largest ski area in central Oregon, with terrain for all levels. The mountain is an extinct volcano, and you can ski with full lift service 360 degrees off the top for 3,365 vertical feet to the base, often through light, dry powder! It has the highest skiable elevation of any resort in Oregon or Washington and is far enough inland for drier snow conditions. The resort gets an average of 462 inches of snow a year on 88 runs, served by 10 lifts. (Mt. Bachelor is adding over 400 acres of ski terrain that is scheduled for opening in 2015). In addition, the resort has more than a dozen cross-country trails, 35 miles of which are groomed. The mountain grooms 40 of the 88 runs. Volunteer Mountain Hosts will ski with you all or part of the day, at your request.



The mountain is a 30-minute bus ride from Bend, where you will be staying in the newly upgraded Double Tree Hotel. There is an indoor pool and hot tub. You can walk to the historic downtown district of Bend, which has lots of shops and restaurants. Buses will pick you up at the hotel and take you directly to the mountain, where you will store your skis. No long walks are involved. Non-skiers will have options to go to Crater Lake, the town of Three Sisters, wine tasting, dog sledding, snowshoeing and more.


